Marie Louise Trottier Cain,

101, passed away on Friday, September 11, 2015, at the Golden Living Center in Florence, Wisconsin.

She was the daughter of Henry Joseph Trottier, a retired Iron Mountain police chief, and Laura Emily Trepanier Trottier, and was a lifelong resident of Iron Mountain.

Marie is the widow of George Henry Cain who was killed in 1943 in the collision of two Liberty ships in Chesapeake Bay during WWII. As the area's first war widow to give birth after the death of her husband, she never forgot – and often remarked – about the graciousness of area residents, even strangers, who acknowledged her only child's birth. She was preceded in death by her daughter, Diane Marie Cain, who died in 2010; and her siblings, Henry, Jr., Marian, Alfred and Donald Trottier.

Marie is survived by her brother, John Trottier of Iron River; Cain nieces: Gladys Halpin of Dandridge, TN; Marilyn Dahlquist of Marquette; Nancy Ball of San Antonio, TX; and Beverly (Fred) Bates of Mansfield Township; and Darlene Trottier (Richard) Anderson of Iron River; nephews: William B. (Geri) Trottier of Yorktown, VA; Henry (Caroline) Trottier of Escanaba.

Marie was a lifetime member of St. Mary and St. Joseph Catholic Church.

Private graveside services will be held at a later date with burial in the Iron Mountain Cemetery next to her husband, parents and siblings.
