



Marie A. "Sissy" LaJeunesse

April 22, 1966 - January 7, 2023

Marie Arlene "Sissy" LaJeunesse, 56, of Six Mile Lake near Felch, MI, passed away January 7, 2023, at Freeman's Nursing Home surrounded by loved ones.

Sissy was born on April 22 in Iron Mountain, MI, to the late Joseph & Marie (Hanson) LaJeunesse. As a toddler Sissy lived above Firme Plumbing, her father's business on Hughitt Street where she often visited other local businesses. Then in the early 1970's her parents made their cottage at Six Mile Lake, their home where Sissy began making friends with everyone around the lake.

Sissy attended Catholic school, Roosevelt Elementary and North Dickinson School until the Mid 1990's; then it was on to her over 20 year working career at North Dickinson School in Felch. Known as "Miss Sissy", she had many responsibilities at the school and her desk was next to the principal's desk with the placard, "Assistant Vice Principal." She thought she ran the school.

In the summer of 1999, Sissy participated in the World Special Olympics in Raleigh, NC. Her event was swimming where she took home 3 bronze medals and met Arnold Schwarzenegger. If you were a kid and swam at Six Mile Lake, you probably have a memory of Sissy holding you under water, thinking you were going to drown until she let you go, and she would surface laughing

at you.

Sissy loved ancestry, painting, drawing, animals, going to country music concerts with her sisters, playing with her dolls, and watching her favorite TV shows and movies, all the while with a Slinky in her hand. Most of all, Sissy loved people and parties, especially the parties at Six Mile Lake with family and friends.

After her parents passed, Sissy made her home in Randville, MI, living with her nephew and his wife, Paul and Lisa Loar. Even though she loved living in Randville, her heart belonged at Six Mile Lake.

Along with her parents, Sissy is preceded in death by a brother, Joseph LaJeunesse; 2 sisters, Mildred Ann LaJeunesse and Mary Louise Rossato; a brother-in-law, Mario Rossato; 4 brothers, Larry, Wayne, Paul and Martin Loar; niece, Kelly Loar; and nephew, John Rossato.

Sissy is survived by her brother, Jim LaJeunesse; her guardians, Paul and Lisa Loar; sisters-in-law, Sara LaJeunesse and Patricia Loar; aunt, Roberta "Bobbie" (Gordon) Powell; and many nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews, cousins and friends.

I have many fond memories of her. When Joe was home bound and ill my mom would stop with communion for Joe, Marie and Sissy. Sweet Sissy took this very seriously and would receive her communion and fold her hands and pray with all her might. I can picture it to this day. In the 1980’s she was excited to come with or catechism class Caroling. I also remember how proud she was of the player piano in their living room.

In 2008 my dad became ill in late August and then diagnosed with cancer. By Halloween, he was very thin and frail and he surprised us all by agreeing to dress up and hand out candy for the kids. When Sissy came in she was soooo excited to see him dressed in costume! Sheer delight! After awhile she turned serious for a moment and asked “OMAN, you gunna be okay????” He gently answered “no, but it will be okay Sissy”... this time he welcomed the hug! That was sissy to many of us, fun loving, loved the simplicity of things yet so caring and kind.

Over the years she was a joy to be greeted with a big bear hug and a giggle and see handing out the program for the various concerts, or at a family wedding, graduation parties etc...and a few times I ran into her at the casino and she was lit up as bright as the machines so excited to be "playing slots".

We all meet that special someone that can brighten your day with a smile and one word when you see her and for me it will FOREVER echo in my mind "OMAN"!!! 💕

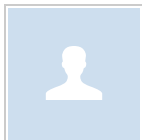
