Mary Ann Wyble, 66, of Kingsford, passed away Sunday, February 2, 2025 at Marshfield Medical Center- Dickinson, following a brief illness.

Mary Ann was born on July 8, 1958 in Iron Mountain, daughter of the late Alfred and Kathleen (Quagliotti) Schinderle. She was a lifelong resident of the area, and graduated from Kingsford High School in 1976. She worked in banking for a short time before accepting a Human Resources position at Nelson Paint. She spent 43 years there before her retirement.

On December 29, 1998 Mary Ann married Aaron Wyble in Iron Mountain. The two shared nearly 30 years together until his death in 2013. Mary Ann loved spending time with Aaron, especially at camp and out in nature. 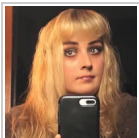

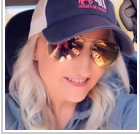
