FLORENCE, Wis. - Oneeda "Sis" Haevers, 88, of Florence, died Saturday, April 5, 2008, at the Dickinson County Memorial Hospital in Iron Mountain.

She was born on Aug. 23, 1919, in Iron River, daughter of the late Joseph and Maude (Beauchamp) Nault. She moved to Green Bay in 1938, where she later met and married Fred "Casey" Haevers on Oct. 11, 1958. He preceded her in death in October 1995. She retired and returned to Florence in 1998.

Sis was a loyal Green Bay Packers fan and an avid deer hunter in her earlier years. During World War II, while all the men were off to war, she became Iron Mountain's first female delivery driver. She enjoyed more than anything spending time with her family.

Sis is survived by her daughter, Sharon (Keith) Opolka of Florence; sister, Delores Brueckner of Milwaukee; grandchildren, Lauren and Chase Opolka of Florence; and several nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by six brothers, Francis, Raphael, Desty, Donald, Robert and Lewis "Spike" Nault.

Visitation will be Thursday from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the Erickson-Rochon & Nash Funeral Home in Iron Mountain.

Funeral services will follow at 7 p.m. at the funeral home. Pastor Bradley Moore will officiate.
