KINGSFORD - Philip H. Smith, 83, of 1865 Riverview Drive, Kingsford, died on Monday, March 7, 2005, at ManorCare Health Services in Kingsford.

He was born on Oct. 19, 1921, in Milwaukee, son of the late Philip and Rose (Prausa) Smith. He graduated from Bayview High School in 1940. In 1941, Philip joined the U.S. Army and served with the 32nd Division in North Africa and Italy until 1945.

He married Dorothy Hyland on June 19, 1946, in Spruce, Wis. Dorothy preceded him in death in April 2004.

He resided in the Milwaukee area for 62 years. Philip worked in retail for 45 years before retiring and moving to Kingsford. He loved woodworking and crafted custom inlaid gun stocks as a hobby. He also loved to fish and spend quality time with his family.
