



Quentin Peterson

KINGSFORD - Quentin "Que" Peterson, 91, of Kingsford, died on Thursday, Oct. 29, 2009, at the Oscar G. Johnson Veterans Hospital in Iron Mountain.

He was born on Sept. 1, 1918, in Foster City, son of the late Swan and Emelia (Dahl) Peterson. Quentin was a 1936 graduate of Felch High School, and then went on to receive his bachelor's degree in agriculture and commerce from Northern Michigan University in 1942.

He was a United States Army veteran of World War II and was stationed at the War College in Washington D.C. from 1942-45.

Quentin married the former Esther Smeths on Sept. 18, 1943, at Our Saviours Lutheran Church in Iron Mountain. Esther preceded him in death in 1982.

Quentin began his working career as a high school teacher and principal in Hermansville from 1945 to 1947. He was then employed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture as a soil conservationist for 31 years, retiring in 1976.

Quentin was a member of First Covenant Church in Iron Mountain and a past president of the Iron Mountain-Kingsford Kiwanis Club.

He served Dickinson County in many capacities over the years including the county planning commission, the Fumee Lake Commission and many other service boards and organizations. He was instrumental in the development of the Sturgeon River Impoundment.

Quentin was dedicated to the preservation and betterment of Dickinson County. His entire life was a commitment to the land, the environment and ecology. Quentin was happiest in the woods or in his garden.

He was an avid fan of the Kingsford Flivvers, University of Michigan Wolverines and Chicago Cubs.

He enjoyed gardening, golf and timber management.

Quentin loved his family and was proud of his Swedish heritage.

In addition to his wife, he was preceded in death by his granddaughter, Su Lin Wilkinson, three sisters and five brothers.

He is survived by two daughters, Ruth Ellen (John) Wilkinson of Kingsford and Karol (David Dvorak) Peterson of Richland, Mich; his grandson, TJ Wilkinson (fiance, Shirley Thomas); his devoted friend of more than 17 years, Delores Luba; his best friend and constant supporter, Walt Summers; young friend, neighbor and helper, Josh McCole and his morning breakfast group that meant so much to him. He was also survived by generations of nieces and nephews.

Visitation will be on Monday, Nov. 2, 2009, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon at the First Covenant Church in Iron Mountain.

The funeral service will follow at 12 noon on Monday at the Church. Rev.

Peter Erickson will officiate.

Burial will be in Cemetery Park in Iron Mountain.

In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made in his memory to the Fumee Lake Natural Area (Entry Gate), The Nature Conservancy or the World Mission Prayer League.
