IRON MOUNTAIN - Randall S. "Randy" Jones, 52, of Kingsford, died Friday, Dec. 5, 2008, at Dickinson County Memorial Hospital after a long and courageous battle with cancer.

He was born on Dec. 2, 1956, in Iron Mountain, the son of the late Edwin A. and Arline J. Jones.
