



Robert "Bob" Harry Davidson

November 10, 1942 - July 20, 2025

Robert "Bob" Harry Davidson, 82, of Felch entered into the presence of his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on Sunday, July 20, 2025, while visiting his son in Traverse City to enjoy some baseball.

Bob was born in Chicago, IL, on November 10, 1942, son of the late Harry and Lucile (Bayles) Davidson. After graduating from Felch High School in 1960, Bob completed his bachelor's degree in physical education from Central Michigan University in 1967, and then he earned his Master's Degree in Arts and Education from Northern Michigan University in 1979. During that time, he also served in the U.S. Army.

On August 15, 1969, Bob married the former Darlene Kangas, who preceded him in death on November 8, 2014; they were married for 45 years. Bob and Darlene enjoyed traveling for Gideon conventions, managing baseball teams, and spending time with their families. After Darlene's passing, Bob reconnected with a Felch classmate, and on September 18, 2016, Bob married Pat Nylund. The two of them enjoyed exploring different restaurants, going to concerts, and attending many conferences for the church. Pat and Bob shared almost nine years together.

Bob began teaching at Felch High School, which transitioned to North Dickinson, where he taught physical education and history for 30 years. Bob's

athleticism and love of sports kept him active. He loved running, working out in the school gym, and was always ready for a game of badminton. At North Dickinson he was known as Mr. D and was the eternal coach, always supporting and encouraging students in athletics and academics. He touched many lives throughout his teaching career, retiring in 1997. He actively supported the Nordic athletic program, attending many different sports, along with scorekeeping at basketball games and announcing or running the scoreboard at football games.

Bob had a passion for baseball. He played for Central Michigan University and in more recent years enjoyed attending the annual alumni game. Playing and managing the local Felch community team with enthusiasm provided many happy memories. He spent many joyful summers coaching and playing the game. He continued to play in the Men's Senior Baseball League in Arizona well into his seventies. A devoted Detroit Tigers fan, Bob loved everything related to America's favorite pastime.

Bob also had a steadfast faith. Reading the Bible each morning and sharing a devotional with his family was the start of his day. He was a member of the Abiding Word Free Lutheran Church. Bob taught Sunday school for numerous years and served with The Gideons International for 50 years. He witnessed at the local jail for many years. Bob's Bible was always with him; a well-worn treasure filled with important events, lessons, and notes.

A true "Yooper," Bob enjoyed being in the woods. Deer hunting, fishing for brook trout, and logging were some of his favorites. After retirement, Bob logged in the woods full time, happy to spend his time in the great outdoors.

Bob was a devoted family leader and enjoyed supporting those he loved. As a grandfather, he frequently drove to his grandchildren's sporting, musical, and school events to show his love and support. Bob loved connecting with people

he cared about. His children, grandchildren, friends, and relatives can all attest to the uplifting power of his loving calls and letters always ending with the encouraging statement "Stay in the word."

Bob will be deeply missed by his wife, Pat; 2 children, Candy (Scott) Schoenborn and Joshua (Heidi) Davidson; 4 grandchildren, Emma (Willow) Elser, Ailie Schoenborn, Anna Davidson, and Paul Davidson; 4 siblings, Ed (Janet) Davidson, Doug Davidson, Ann (Randy) Sheldon, and Murial (Jim) Bratcher; and many more family and friends.

Bob is preceded in death by his parents, Harry and Lucile; his first wife, Darlene; and a sister-in-law, Cynda.

This is by brother Doug,

I was the middle of 5 kids. Bob & Ed were born a year apart and 5 & 6 years older than me. They were the quintessential Big Brothers, always looking out for me.

They taught me to play baseball & basketball and to work in the woods and drive a car & tractor. They coached the Felch babe ruth League team when I played.

Bob played for Felch in the Wishigan League for many years. one summer he had an emergency appendectomy in the middle of the week. Of course, he suited up and played that Sunday, well before he had fully recovered. It wasn't his best day at the plate but he played all 9 innings.

When Darlene asked what he did in the Army he said, " I was the millionaire". She asked what he did with the money! He said, " I gave it all away." Now the rest of the story: He was a clerk in the base payroll office (probably because he learned to type at FHS.) Every month he went to the bank to pick up the cash payroll for the entire base. So every month he was a "millionaire" until he gave it all away. His other role there was to play on the base baseball team.

He didn't just like fishing for brook trout. The family had a contest each summer to see who would catch the most. After baseball, deer hunting was his next favorite activity.

He had a vast collection of country music. He & Ed are a big reason I am a fan too, & indirectly, I suppose, my 4 children. Not to mention our youngest granddaughter who has already been to a Lainey Wilson concert. My cars Sirius channel is on 61 Willies Roadhouse.

At 82 many of Bob's friends have died before him. 2 in particular were special to him. Vernon "Mink" Steele was his high school classmate, trapping partner and fellow logger. At CMU, Leo Durocher (a Yooper from Freda) was his roommate, teammate, and fellow piece cutter. They cut rough popple around Mount Pleasant. They lived off campus and supplemented their diet with venison (high speed beef). Thanks in part to a successful deer hunt on Jack & Donna Cootware's farm.

He always said to work hard. When I helped him cut peeled popple he started the work day by cutting 8 or 10 sticks and said, "that is for the boss". After that was done, then he started counting for himself. After piling a particularly heavy log he would say, "that will put lead in your pencil".

Bob worked in the woods his whole life except while in the Army in

Germany. After he retired from teaching he fired up his Iron Mule and did it full time. Later he bought an even bigger skidder & ran both of them, sometimes with the help of our Dad. He got his logging jobs mostly by word of mouth, often small jobs. When he cut by a subdivision near Iron Mountain he said he was "setting standards for the industry" because he had blacktop skidding trails.

Mom thought one of the things he did most in the woods was get stuck! There is always a wet spot you just can't get through and he knew how to find them.

It seems ironic for a man who loved cutting all kinds of wood products that he detested cutting firewood! He disliked making firewood so much that he quit heating with wood and removed the wood stove from the basement so he wouldn't be tempted to start again.

He bought a new 1966 or 1967 Ford Mustang and put around 300,000 miles on it, I think. I have to wonder how many of those miles were at or below the speed limit. He always seemed to be on a tight schedule, mostly getting to sporting events.

In August of 1967 he let me take the Mustang to MSU for my week of orientation. I parked in a lot across the street from the State Police headquarters. I thought it was a safe place. When I was leaving to go home, I noticed the hub caps had been stolen! Bob teased me more than once that I "borrowed his car & sold the hub caps". Nevertheless, he loaned it to me again in July 1979 to visit my fiance' in Muskegon. That time the car came back in one piece.

Finally, a life high light for both of us was going to Game 5 of the 1968 World Series in Detroit. He & I both applied for 2 tickets. My envelope won. He picked my up at MSU (in his Mustang). Tigers were down to St. Louis 3 games to 1 in the series. My favorite player, Al Kaline, drove in the game winning run. Tigers went on to win the series for the first time since 1945 also against St. Louis.
