Robert Scott Leskoviansky, 55, of Ironwood, died Tuesday, May 3, 2011, at the Oscar G. Johnson V A Medical Center in Iron Mountain, after a courageous two year battle with multiple myeloma.

He was born March 22, 1956, in Ironwood, the son of Rose (Gironimi) Leskoviansky and the late Robert Leskoviansky. Scott graduated from Luther L. Wright High School class of 1975 and he also attended college.

Upon graduation, Scott enlisted in the U.S. Army and spent one and a half years of his three year stint in Vicenza, Italy. Upon his return home, he enlisted in the U.S. National Guard for a number of years and worked as a laborer at various jobs.
