Robert W. Oliver, 67, of East Kingsford, passed away Wed. Oct. 8, 2014 at the Oscar G. Johnson VA Medical Center, after a three month bout with lung cancer. He was born on April 19, 1947 in Iron Mountain, the son of Clarence and Genevieve (LaHaie) Oliver.

Robert graduated from Kingsford High School in 1965. He served for two as a medic in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War. He was injured after the first three months was awarded a purple heart.

Robert lived in California and Florida for many years. In 1990 he moved back to Kingsford. He was a C.N.A. at Maryhill Manor in Niagara until 2008. He was an avid race fan and dog lover. He enjoyed playing Bingo, and going to the casino.
