Robert Alan Weber, 57, of Homestead, died unexpectedly on Sunday, Oct. 17, 2010, at the Oscar G. Johnson VA Medical Center in Iron Mountain.

He was born on May 30, 1953, in Iron Mountain. After graduating from Florence High School, Bob served in the United States Army from 1972-74 in Germany. He worked as a custodian for the Breitung Township Schools for 18 years. Bob also served as the Homestead town chairman for several years.
