Ronald Frank Calovecchi, 70, of Kingsford, died Tues. Aug. 24, 2010 at Marquette General Hospital. He was born on March 1, 1940 in Iron Mountain, the son of the late Frank and Priscilla (Cormier) Calovecchi.

He graduated from Kingsford High School in 1958. Ron began his career at Ball & Christy Furniture Store and Grede Foundry. He then went to the Police Academy.
