IRON MOUNTAIN - Ruth M. Erickson, formerly of 603 East B St. in Iron Mountain, died Sunday, Feb. 8, 2009. She was 101 years old.

Ruth was born Aug. 11, 1907, in Niagara, Wis., daughter of the late Charles and Anna (Peterson) Magnuson. She graduated with the first graduating class of the Quinnesec High School in 1927, and was a lifelong resident of the area. After high school, Ruth attended St. Lukes Nursing College in Chicago, Ill. for two years.

Ruth married Gustav Erickson in 1929 in Iron Mountain. He preceded her in death on Dec. 8, 1986. Ruth was a homemaker and raised three sons.

Ruth is survived by two sons, Neil (Dixie) Erickson of Norman, Okla. and Ivan (Judy) Erickson of Roseburg, Ore.; a nephew, Bill (Mavis) Anderson of Grass Lake, Mich.; seven grandchildren; and four great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by a son, Reed Erickson; a brother, Rudolph Magnuson; and a sister, Agnes Anderson.

Visitation will be Tuesday from 12 noon to 1 p.m. at the Erickson-Rochon & Nash Funeral Home in Iron Mountain.

The funeral service will follow Tuesday at 1 p.m. at the funeral home. Pastor Kevin Sullivan will officiate.
