Shirley Ann Skogman, 78, of Foster City, passed away Monday, March 8, 2021, at Dickinson County Healthcare System in Iron Mountain.

Shirley was born September 17, 1942, in a small log cabin in Foster City, MI. She was the daughter of the late Edwin and Lucille (Dixon) Oman. Shirley graduated from Felch High School in 1960 as the salutatorian of her class and was a lifelong resident of the area. Shirley married Norman Skogman on Oct. 8, 1960, at Zion Lutheran Church in Felch, MI. Together they worked on their family potato farm for over 50 years. Shirley was a very social person and enjoyed working at a few local restaurants as well. She was a longtime member of Zion Lutheran Church in Metropolitan and more recently the Abiding Word Free Lutheran Church. Her Christian faith was her strength and her life, and with rejoicing is now her eternal salvation. She was very active in the church serving on the Ladies Aide, the Church Council, as financial secretary and teaching Sunday School. She was a member of the Gideons Women's Auxiliary and sat on the board of directors for the Michigan Seed Potato Association. Shirley was appointed to the Michigan Agriculture Commission under Gov. Engler. In her spare time, Shirley enjoyed playing Bingo and cards, camping, traveling, and wintering in Lake Havasu City, AZ. She loved spending time with her family, friends and her dog, Bingo. Most importantly, she was proud to say, she loved God, family and community.
