Terry J. "Norm" Campbell, 54, of Iron Mountain passed away on Sunday, May 29, 2011 at Dickinson County Memorial Hospital.

Terry was born October 26, 1956 in Iron Mountain, the son of Margaret (Paradiso) Campbell and the late Paul Campbell. He graduated from Kingsford High School in 1974 and was a lifelong resident of the area. Terry worked at Four Seasons Distributing for many years as a driver. He also owned and operated the Little Buckhorn Bar and Grill in Kingsford for several years. Currently he was employed by S.D. Myers as a transformer technician. Terry had a passion for ski jumping. He competed when he was a youth and continued his involvement as a member of the Kiwanis Ski Club and as a youth ski jumping instructor.
