KINGSFORD - Timothy James Campbell, 54, of 317 Harrison Ave., Kingsford, died, Tuesday, April 12, 2005, at the V.A. Medical Center in Iron Mountain.

Tim was born June 3, 1950, in Munising, son of the late Gordon and Audrey (Schamberger) Campbell. He graduated from Mathers High School in Munising.

Tim enlisted in the United States Marine Corps, where he served two tours in Vietnam from 1969 to 1971. Tim served with distinction during his time in the Marine Corps and received several decorations. He worked as a laborer in construction for most of his life.

He married Bernadine Case in Iron Mountain in August 1994.

Tim was a member of the American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), and the Disabled American Veterans (DAV). He was also a member of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians. He enjoyed hunting, fishing, western movies and grilling out with his family.

He is survived by his wife, Bernadine Campbell of Kingsford; two sons, Mark and Adam Campbell; three stepsons, Wesley Nicolls of Spread Eagle, Wis., Nick Nicolls of Kingsford, and Don Jones of Iron Mountain; a stepdaughter, Misty Blue of Kingsford; four brothers, Gordon "Bacco" (Helen) Campbell of Milwaukee, Jim (Judy) Campbell of Manitowoc, Wis., David Campbell of Wisconsin Rapids, Wis., Donald (Teresa) Campbell of Iron Mountain; four sisters, Judy (Ron) Latvala, Candy (Bob) Hertzler, Joan (Emond) Gundick,
