QUINNESEC - Timothy J. Groleau, 52, of 706 Mullen St., Quinnesec, died Sunday, May 11, 2008, of injuries sustained in a dirt biking accident in Humboldt Township.

Tim was born Aug. 27, 1955, in Clintonville, Wis. He was a 1973 graduate of Kingsford High School and served in the United States Marine Corps from 1975 to 1978. Tim has worked as an auto body technician for Zam's Services for many years. He has also owned and operated The Lawn Service for the past 21 years.

Tim married the former Joan Bellmore on Sept. 21, 1991, at Calvary Lutheran Church in Quinnesec.

Tim's love of music began when he started playing the drums at age three. Over the years, he has played in several local bands. Tim enjoyed riding his RD400 street bike and his dirt bike. He also enjoyed restoring vintage Rupp snowmobiles and walking the dogs.

Tim loved his family, especially his grandchildren. He was a member of Bethany Lutheran Church in Norway where he was a Sunday School teacher and confirmation guide. Tim was also a member of the Floriano-Stecker American Legion Post 340 in Hermansville.
