



## Wallace Douglas

July 4, 1915 - July 4, 2010

Wallace Douglas, 95, of Iron Mountain, formerly of Highland Falls, New York, went home to be with the Lord, on Sunday, July 4, 2010, at his home.

He was born in Highland Falls, on Feb. 28, 1915, son of the late William and Mabel (Coombs) Douglas. After graduating from high school, Wally was a field supervisor in the Civilian Conservation Corps, he then joined the forestry department at the United States Military Academy at West Point, NY.

On July 4, 1943, he enlisted in the United States Navy, serving during World War II, and was stationed aboard the U.S.S. Unimak. Upon being honorably discharged from the Navy, he worked at the military academy for over 37 years, retiring in 1970 as the fixed mechanical equipment maintenance supervisor.

He married Marjorie Therien on July 2, 1939, and she preceded him in death on Nov. 26, 2005. Together they resided in Highland Falls, NY until 2002, when they moved to Michigan's Upper Peninsula to be close to their son and grandchildren.

He was a former member of Holy Innocents Episcopal Church and the Black Rock and Town of Highlands Fish and Game Clubs. Wally was also a member of the Highland Falls Volunteer Fire Department where he also served as a

past fire chief.

He enjoyed fishing, gardening, and later traveling and visiting family.

Wallace is survived by his son, Lawrence (Betzy) Douglas of Iron Mountain; grandchildren, Marjorie Dixon and Millicent Douglas of Menominee; great-grandchildren, Merissa of Wisconsin and Jessica of Florida.

He was preceded in death by his grandson, Lawrence Douglas Jr.
