IRON MOUNTAIN - Warren J. Roberts, M.D., 85, died Wednesday, April 29, 2009, at Dickinson County Memorial Hospital after a short illness.

He was born in the small town of Columbus, Wis. on April 9, 1923, son of the late John Jay and Margaret (Owens) Roberts. He spent his youth in Columbus where he won music and vocal competitions playing the violin and singing. He loved sports and played football, basketball, and baseball all through high school.

He attended Carroll College for a year and then transferred to Michigan State University. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy and was assigned to a medical corps. He returned to Michigan State in the pre-medical program. While there, he met and courted the undying love of his life, Helen Ann Jolliffe. They were married in Lansing on July 7, 1945.

He attended medical school at Wayne State University in Detroit and did his internship at Sparrow Hospital in Lansing. He was called back into the service, the U.S. Army, after three years of general practice in Arkansas. While in the army, he went on to specialize in orthopedic surgery. He completed his active duty with a 16 month tour in Seoul, Korea and six months at Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

Late in 1960, he moved his family to Iron Mountain where he joined the medical staff at the newly opened VA Hospital. In 1973 he left the VA Hospital and started a private practice in Iron Mountain. He became the first orthopedic surgeon at Dickinson Memorial Hospital. His son, Gary Roberts, M.D., joined him late in 1977.

Warren remained in full active practice for the next eight years and then slowly decreased his workload over the next 12 years before retiring. During his career as an orthopedic surgeon, he was Board Certified and selected as a Fellow of both the Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons and the College of Surgeons. He was a founding member of the American Trauma Society and received a special recognition citation from the mayor of Seoul, Korea for his volunteer work with the orphaned children. He joined a group of local physicians to build a medical office building with the goal of attracting new doctors to the Iron Mountain-Kingsford area in 1975.

During the various phases of his 48 year career, he was an active member of the First Presbyterian Church, an enthusiastic member of the Great Books Club, and sang the baritone part in the yearly Easter production of the Seven Last Words.

He and his wife enjoyed golf and tennis. Warren treasured her friendship and companionship throughout his lifetime. He willingly loaded several pounds of photography equipment through the woods for her on the numerous trips to photograph flowers and birds. He enjoyed numerous family tennis, ping pong, and baseball tournaments through the years. He remained enjoyably competitive until Alzheimer's disease made it impossible to participate. He enjoyed watching his grandchildren carry on his athletic legacy when he wasn't cheering on the Chicago Cubs, Green Bay Packers, or the MSU Spartans.

He remained an avid reader throughout his life and enjoyed classical music and opera. He had a great sense of humor and his laughter will be missed by all who knew him.

He is survived by his wife of 63 years, Helen; five children; Gary (Wendy) Roberts, M.D. of Iron Mountain, JoAnn (George) Dyzikes of Western Springs, Ill., David (Amy) Roberts of Swampscott, Mass., Donald (Chris) Roberts of Chelesee, Mich., and John (Teresa) Roberts of Columbus, Ohio; one sister, Dorothy Scholtens of Ft. Myers, Fla.; 17 grandchildren, Jason (Michelle) Roberts, Nikole (Peter) Drever, Jessica (Scott) Cameron, Nathan (Michelle) Roberts, Megan Roberts, Jaclynn Roberts, Kelsey Roberts, Jaime Roberts, Cindy Dyzikes, Stephanie Dyzikes, Emma Roberts, Camille Roberts, Scott Yates, Joel Yates, Jay Roberts, Sujata Roberts, and Zachary Roberts; and 13 great-grandchildren
